A note from Pastor Eric:

School is back in session and we are hitting the ground running this September. At our Leadership Retreat last month, we reviewed our Vision Statement: "God our Focus, People our Mission!" and then discussed what our goal or objective as a church should be. In the end we came up with the following statement:

"Our objective is to grow mature and fruitful disciples of Jesus."

In other words, we don't just want people to give their lives to Christ and then stay as spiritual babies the rest of their lives, we want our church to be producing mature believers who grow in their faith and go out and share the Gospel with others and create other mature believers that repeat the same process. This is what healthy discipleship looks like. We discussed the fact that deep discipleship happens in the context of strong relationships. So, our discussion then focused on what steps we need to take to help people develop stronger relationships with others and mature in their faith. This process has several steps and different ways to approach it, and we are starting with some basic steps upon which we will build other initiatives. To start off, we will be bringing back our Welcome Center. Actually, we're creating two Welcome Centers. One will be in the area outside the Shelley Prayer room and small conference room, the other will be in the Library behind the Sanctuary. Our hope is that these two areas will be places where people can congregate, grab a cup of coffee, tea, or hot cocoa, and connect with one another. We plan to have these areas "staffed" with volunteers who can help share information, point visitors in the right direction, and be a friendly face to greet those who stop by. We will also have displays or handouts about upcoming events, church ministries, and other helpful information for people to know about. Additionally, we will be planning more regular church get-togethers where we can share a meal and grow in our relationships across age groups and ministries. More information will be coming out soon, so keep an eye out for those activities, and come visit one of our "Welcome Centers" on a Sunday morning. I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life. John 8:12

As I sat in the courtroom, I witnessed several examples of the brokenness of our world: a daughter estranged from her mother; a husband and wife who'd lost the love they once had and now shared only bitterness; a husband who yearned to be reconciled with his wife and to be reunited with his children. They desperately needed changed hearts, healed wounds, and for God's love to prevail.

Sometimes when the world around us seems to hold only darkness and despair, it's easy to give in to despair. But then the Spirit, who lives inside believers in Christ (John 14:17), reminds us that Jesus died for that brokenness and pain. When He came into the world as a human, He brought light into the darkness (1:4–5; 8:12). We see this in His conversation with Nicodemus, who furtively came to Jesus in the cover of darkness but left impacted by the Light (3:1–2; 19:38–40).

Jesus taught Nicodemus that "God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life" (3:16).

Yet even though Jesus brought light and love into the world, many remain lost in the darkness of their sin (v. 19–20). If we're His followers, we have the light that dispels darkness. In gratitude, let's pray that God will make us beacons of His love (Matthew 5:14–16).
