



A Note from Pastor Eric

Pentecost is the 19th of May this year. It is the day when we celebrate that God gave us the Holy Spirit (Ac 2:1-4) as a comforter (Jn 14:16), counselor (Jn 14:26), and down payment on His promises of eternal life and co-inheritance with Jesus (Eph 1:13-14). Before Pentecost, the Holy Spirit only occasionally came upon God's people, and only for a limited time or for a specific purpose. However, after Jesus rose again and returned to the Father's side, He promised that He would send the Holy Spirit to be with His people forever (Jn 14:16).

For many years I did not fully grasp the incredible gift that this is for believers. When I was younger, I was reading about King Solomon, the wisest man to ever live, and became discouraged when I thought about how the wisest man in history derailed his life at the end by compromising his faith. He built temples for the false gods of his many foreign wives and let it affect his own faith (1 Ki 11:1-8). "If the wisest man on earth could not make good choices, then what hope do the rest of us have?", I wondered. Then God reminded me that Solomon did not have the Holy Spirit inhabiting him and giving him the power and ability to live for God. The Pharisees and religious elite that misinterpreted the Jewish Scriptures and created all kinds of burdensome rules for people to follow, and who did not recognize God's Messiah (Jn 1:10-11) did not have the Holy Spirit either.

But we have been given a Spirit that brings us into God's family as adopted children and allows us to call out "Abba (Daddy), Father" (Rom 8:15-16); a Spirit that brings conviction of sin (Jn 16:8) and power to overcome the sin nature in us (Rom 8:1-2). We have received a Spirit that helps us understand Scripture and God's commands to us (1 Cor 2:10-16). What an incredible blessing it is for us to live in a time after God has given His people the Holy Spirit. Those religious leaders in the Old Testament and during Jesus' time would have thought unthinkable that we could approach God as a small child does their daddy, that we could have that kind of close, loving relationship with the Creator of all the universe. So, may you feel your Heavenly Daddy's arms around you. May you desire to sit in His lap and learn from Him and grow deeper in love with Him as you follow Him each day. May God's Spirit fill you with joy, courage, and conviction to live for the one who loves you more than you can imagine with all that you are.

God is With Us



As I read the following devotion, I thought about the importance of remembering that God is with us in all of our situations and has plans for us. Look around; where do you see God working among us? Let's join Him, as we know He is faithful to fulfilling His promises. As you read the devotion below, I believe you will have the same thoughts I did."

I will come to you and fulfill my good promise to bring you back to this place. (Jeremiah 29:10)

It had been years since we left the Oregon town where we raised our family. We'd made great memories there, and the recent visit reminded me of moments I'd forgotten: our girls' soccer games, our old home, church gatherings, and our friends' Mexican restaurant. The town had changed, but there was enough of the familiar to spark my desire to return for a visit.

When the Israelites went into exile in Babylon, they missed the familiarity of people, landmarks, and culture. They forgot they'd been exiled for rebelling against God. When false prophets told the exiles they'd return home within two years (Jeremiah 28:2-4; 29:8-9), they found a receptive audience. It was easy to listen to the slick words of false prophets who promised a return home soon.

God didn't take kindly to these peddlers of the past and their false promises. "Do not let the prophets and diviners among you deceive you," He said (29:8). He had plans for His people, "plans to give [them] hope and a future" (v. 11). The situation was challenging, difficult, and new, but God was with them. "You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart," He told them (v. 13). God would bring them "back to the place from which I carried you into exile" (v. 14), but in His timing.

Nostalgia plays tricks on the mind, making it easy to long for what once was. Don't miss what God is doing right now. He will fulfill His promises.
