¹⁷ So all the generations from Abraham to David were fourteen generations; and from David until the exile to Babylon, fourteen generations; and from the exile to Babylon until the Christ, fourteen generations.

The Genealogy of Jesus.

Matthew's genealogy included four women:

Tamar

Rahab

Ruth

The wife of Uriah the Hittite (Bathsheba)

Lessons from Jesus' genealogy:

- 1. He includes men and women.
- 2. He included Jews and Gentiles.

God wants the world to know that He sent His Son, Jesus for all of them. He wants them all to know that there is a place for them at His table if they are willing to respond to His call and to put their faith in Jesus Christ.

3. Among the women selected by Matthew were saints and sinners.

God can use any person who is willing to admit their need for Him, repent, and let God transform them.

"With such a list [of ancestors], Matthew gives us clues about the kinds of people that the Messiah came to save. He was to be a Savior for women and men who were both saints and sinners, Jews and Gentiles."
